


# The cost of living crisis is here to stay

- The average student now spends £1,104/month.
- This is up **2.4%** on the previous year, but follows increases of **17%** and **14%**.
- London is the most expensive (£1,264/month).
- Northern Ireland is the cheapest (£926/month).





# What do students spend their money on?







#### Students should have TWO bank accounts



# **Driving down travel costs**

- Get a Railcard but never pay full price for it.
- If you're in London, you can link Railcards to Oyster cards.
- Book rail travel on websites with **split-ticketing** functionality.
- Avoid websites with **booking fees**.
- Always try to get cashback on ticket purchases (or any purchase!).



# Buying (and packing!) university essentials

- Encourage students not to **overbuy**.
- Avoid overpriced and bloated 'starter kits'.
- Some purchases can wait especially for a **student discount**.
- Stick to a **packing checklist** and remember your flatmates will be bringing stuff too.






